## Mersey Ferries

There has been a ferry route since the 12th century started by the Benedictine Monks at Birkenhead Priory. Ferries run daily to the Wirral Peninsula.



## Royal Liver Building

Designed by W. Aubrey Thomas. It is part of the city's UNESCO World Heritage Maritime Mercantile City. Head office for the Royal Liver Friendly Society.



## Cunard Building

Originally headquarters and main passenger terminal for the Cunard Steamship Company.



## Port of Liverpool Building

Grade II listed building once head quarters of the Mersey Docks and Harbour Company.



## Ventilation Shaft

Built in 1934, this provides ventilation for both the Birkenhead and Wallasey road tunnels. Tunnel tours start from here.



## Billy Fury Statue

Dedicated to Liverpool local rock n roll icon, Billy Fury who died 28th January 1983.



## Museum of Liverpool

Home to the new Museum of Liverpool. Opening 2010.



## Beatles Story Albert Dock

A unique visitor attraction taking you on a journey into the life, times, culture and music of the Beatles.



## The Beatles Story Pier Head

Home to Fab4D, this site also boasts a Fab4Store and an exciting exhibition space.



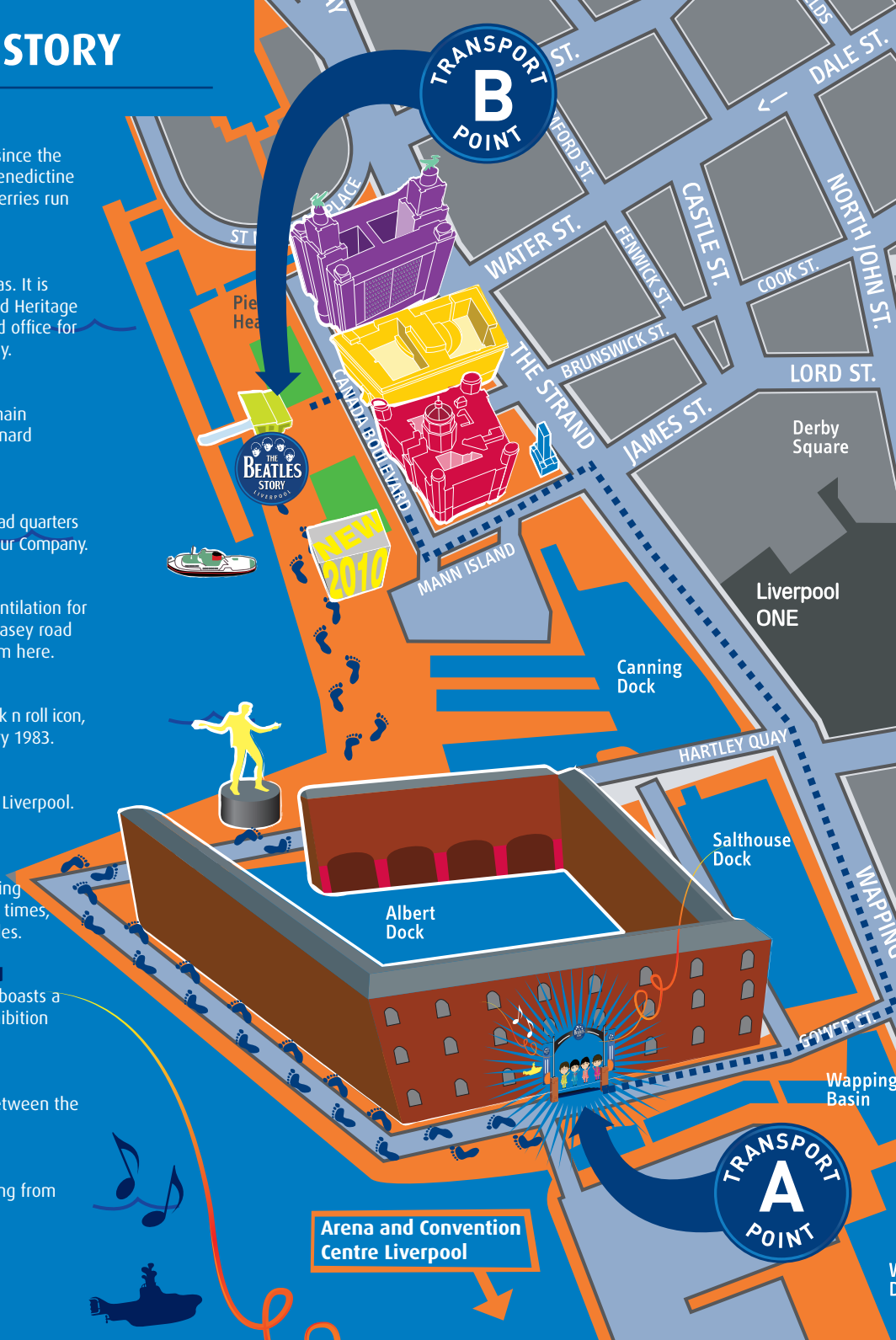
## Transport Routes
